



FBI success stories

On December 24th 2007, Clear Channel Outdoor and the FBI worked together to form a partnership that would take advantage of the new digital outdoor networks ability to react to local conditions quickly and inform the public of important community information. It was decided that two areas were very important and could be a great asset to a local community. The two categories were; posting information about dangerous criminals that may be in the area and local emergency messaging such as hot pursuits or the Minneapolis bridge collapse. Clear Channel Outdoor and the FBI have worked to establish local contacts in all of the communities that currently have digital outdoor displays. The "wanted" displays and emergency information interrupts paid advertising and is donated by Clear Channel Outdoor at no cost to the FBI.

John "Jordan" Lewis

Wanted for murder of Philadelphia police officer Charles "Chuck" Cassidy. Lewis was captured in Miami, FL on 11/6/07. Photos on digital displays lead to some tips of Lewis' whereabouts in Miami.

Pedro Carasquillo

Wanted for rape was displayed in Philadelphia. Two local police officers saw his photo on a CCO digital display and it helped lead to his arrest the same day they saw his photo.

Andre Williams

Wanted for assault and murder was displayed on a CCO digital display in Philadelphia. Andre's former counselor saw his photo, recognized him and immediately called Andre's mother to work with her to help convince Andre to turn himself into the local police.



Larry Lemay Jr.

Wanted for attempted murder on a police officer was arrested in Las Vegas on 12/26/2007

"We caught Larry Lemay last night after a short car chase. We appreciate airing him on your billboards. I have been impressed how many people see the billboards. I had several people who called and told me they saw Lemay and Patten on the billboards just hours after I sent you the information. We had one tip from the billboard come in that put him in the area where we arrested him."

Tyrone Grimes

Wanted on suspicion of killing a young woman in a nightclub in Tampa. Six digital displays in the Tampa area displayed a wanted poster and photo of Tyrone Grimes on January 14th. On January 28th Tyrone Grimes turned himself in to the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Department. The interviewing detective explained that Tyrone's friends and family had contacted him in Miami to explain that they had seen his photo all over the Tampa area and convinced him to turn himself in.

Dennis Martin

Was apprehended following a tip provided after someone saw Martin on a digital billboard in Akron, OH 2008

Stanley Gatson

Armed Bank Robbery, Milwaukee, WI 5/22/08

Please note this is the fastest we have captured a fugitive as a direct result of posting their image on the Clear Channel billboards here in Milwaukee (less than 24 hours). The fugitive told us the reason he turned himself in was because he saw himself up on the billboards!

Walter Haskell

Armed Bank Robbery, South Orange, NJ 11/1/08 (See PRESS RELEASE at the end of document).

Charles Williams

Wanted for Drug Trafficking in Cleveland, OH was arrested on 12/15/08 with the help of tips from calls generated from the digital display.

Glyn Richards

A Federal fugitive who fled from the Philadelphia area and was believed to be hiding in the Tampa, FL area was later arrested when Clear Channel put his picture on billboards in the Tampa area. On 2/7/09, a tip was received from someone who saw the digital display that Richards was staying at a local residence.. The local Sheriff's Office responded to the residence and took Richards into custody.

Filbert Romero

Wanted for Bank Robbery in Albuquerque turned himself in February 2009 when displayed on digital units

Donald Ray Williams

Armored car robbery, Dallas TX 2009 (See PRESS RELEASE at the end of document).

Anthony Stewart

Arrested for Drug conspiracy from tips generated by digital billboard in Milwaukee, WI 2009

Clarence Pittman

Wanted for felonious assault and attempted murder, Pittman was arrested in March of 2009 after a tip from the digital display lead to his arrest in Cleveland Ohio

Ernest Avery

Arrested for Armed Robbery after some tips from the billboard helped police locate Avery in Philadelphia.

Brian Leatherbury

Was wanted in Philadelphia and turned himself in. The billboard coverage was a contributing factor to his decision to surrender. 5/12/09

Willie Williams

Turned himself on 5/26/09, citing the media coverage of his fugitive status. The coverage included one feature in the Daily News and the Billboards.

Jovan Jackson

When the tip was provided to the FBI the tipster told them that they had seen the image on several billboards and that is also how they knew what number to call.

William Worrell

Wanted for Homicide was arrested 9/3/09 by the and the Philadelphia Police Department in a residence in North Philadelphia, as a direct result of a tip received by an individual who reported they had seen him on a digital Clear Channel billboard. Worrell was placed in the rotation on the digital billboards by Clear Channel on 4/14/2009 at the request of the FBI. More info can be obtained by contacting J.J. Jerry Lee Gray

I received word late last week that the Clear Channel boards in Dallas resulted in another successful result. Fugitive Jerry Lee Gray was wanted for multiple bank robberies in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. He was posted on boards in September. A tip led us to an apartment complex where a maintenance worker, upon seeing the suspect's photo, said "yeah, that's the guy from the billboards. He is in apartment xxx." Gray resisted arrest, and was killed in a shootout with FBI agents and Task Force officers in that apartment on September 21. Two task force officers were wounded in the shootout, one critically. Although the tip that led us to the complex was not from the billboards, the maintenance worker knew exactly where he was, which greatly reduced the threat to residents and law enforcement during the takedown operation. As such, we are considering this a billboard success story.

Hazel Bernadette Gutierrez

An unknown female bank robber was profiled on Clear Channel billboards in Albuquerque in December 2009. A tipster phoned the FBI on December 14 after viewing the billboard with information identifying the woman as Hazel Bernadette Gutierrez. It was determined that Gutierrez was already in custody of Albuquerque Police Department on an unrelated matter. Gutierrez admitted to the bank robbery.

Robbi Potter

A dangerous escaped convict with a kidnapped eight-year old girl. (See PRESS RELEASE at the end of document).

Samuel Cresante

Cresante was accused of 11 bank robberies in the Phoenix AZ area between 2009-2010. Cresante was dubbed by the FBI as the "The First Aid Felon" and disguised himself by wearing an arm sling, various bandages on his face and fake blood. The digital display did not have his name but put his photo and information about him on the Phoenix digital network. The FBI noted that the first tip on Cresante came in the day after the digital "wanted" messages were posted.

Gerald Williams

Williams was captured as a direct result of a tip called in by a source who had seen Williams' picture on a digital billboard on I-95 in Philadelphia. Williams was put up on the billboards on 10/20/2009, and had also been featured extensively in the Daily News as a fugitive since February, 2009. No positive tips or leads had been generated until a caller provided information about his whereabouts after seeing his picture on a billboard. He was arrested at the location provided by the caller, without incident. J.J. Klaver, Special Agent – FBI Philadelphia

Ronald Johnson

From a FBI press release on February 17th 2010:

The FBI worked the matter as a fugitive investigation on behalf of the East Orange Police Department. Since February 4, 2010, Johnson had been featured on the Clear Channel Outdoor digital billboards throughout Northern New Jersey, which includes locations on Routes 80, 280, 78, 287, and the New Jersey Turnpike, Northbound and Southbound. The Newark office of the FBI received a tip from a citizen who saw Johnson's picture featured on the billboards and pointed law enforcement in the right direction.

"This is a great example of how technology is helping to build the relationship between the public and law enforcement and make our communities safer. We all owe Clear Channel a debt of gratitude for their assistance – assistance they provide the FBI and the taxpayers free of charge. This capture also demonstrates that the public can make a difference in their community by simply staying alert and picking up the phone when they see something that doesn't look right. There is no room for apathy in today's fast paced world."

Edward Myrick

Myrick was wanted for the distribution of heroin. He turned himself in to authorities in March of 2010 in New Jersey after seeing his picture posted on a CCO New Jersey digital bulletin.

Steve Maiurro

Steve Maiurro was wanted for sex trafficking and surrendered to the FBI on April 23, 2010 after finding out that his photo was posted on an FBI wanted digital display in Times Square.

Ramon Rodriguez


"We appreciate Clear Channel's display of this bank robber on their digital billboards throughout the city because we believe it made the difference in the surrender of this robber," said Special Agent in Charge David Cuthbertson. "Numerous people saw the image on the billboard and contacted us with tips."

James Downtin

Downtin was wanted drug trafficking and Racketeering. He turned himself in to authorities in October of 2010 in New York after seeing his picture posted in Times Square.

John Whitfield Jr., Kellen Reynolds, Curtis Jackson, Garry Phillips

Working with the Lorain Co. Sheriff's Office, these four criminals were arrested within 3 weeks of being posted on a single digital display in Cleveland OH.



Where fugitives get their name up in lights

Walter Haskell walked into a Bank of America branch in South Orange this summer, authorities say, a semi-automatic handgun tucked under his shirt, and slipped the teller a note. "This is a holdup. The money or I'll start shooting," it read, according to court papers.

A digital "Wanted" billboard announces the capture of Walter Haskell, a suspect in a South Orange bank robbery. Police say the billboard helped to produce tips that led to capture. Haskell allegedly escaped with \$5,440, becoming an FBI fugitive. But within hours, his photo, taken from surveillance cameras at the bank, was plastered on "Wanted" posters on six digital billboards across the state.

Last week, federal agents nabbed Haskell in Minnesota with the help of tips from people who saw the billboards and called a 24-hour hotline. He is now in federal custody facing bank robbery charges. Haskell's capture with the help of the billboards was the first FBI success story in New Jersey. They hope it's not the last.


"If we have a crack at over a quarter-million people seeing that photo every day, then we have a very good chance at catching the person we're after," said Special Agent Sean Quinn, a spokesman for the FBI in Newark. "The exposure gets us started."


In Haskell's case, it was police work that provided the first big break. The initial surveillance photos from the bank were posted on the billboards, but they were not of high quality, authorities said. But the FBI's forensic investigators were able to pull a fingerprint from the note the robber handed the teller. A check of the New Jersey State Police Automated Fingerprint Identification system turned up a match with Haskell, authorities said. Agents, who worked the case with South Orange police, ran Haskell's name through the state's motor vehicle database and found his address. By then, he was gone, authorities said, but they replaced the bank surveillance photo with the better quality driver's license photo on all of the billboards. Soon, multiple tips poured in directing agents to a shelter in Minneapolis where Haskell was arrested on Friday October 31st 2008.

The billboards promised a reward, which Quinn said averages around \$2,000, but could go up to tens of thousands of dollars. He said the reward payments were still being worked out in Haskell's case because there were multiple tipsters. He said those tipsters asked that their names not be released.

2nd suspect arrested in 2007 Dallas armored-car robbery

Federal authorities on Sunday arrested a 53-year-old man wanted in a 2007 Dallas armored-car robbery believed to be the biggest of its kind in city history. Donald Ray Williams was arrested about 1:25 p.m. in Rosebud, Texas, about 35 miles south of Waco, said Special Agent Mark White, the Dallas FBI spokesman. The arrest followed a flurry of tips in recent weeks after the posting of digital billboard messages in the area seeking information on Williams.

"Between the digital billboards and the media outlets and the information generated to the public – that led directly to being able to find him," White said. Authorities believe Williams teamed with Freddy Lee Foots, 53, of Dallas in the Sept. 5, 2007, robbery of \$1,977,952 from a Loomis armored car parked at the Compass Bank branch in the 1800 block of Abrams Parkway in Lakewood. Foots was arrested days after the robbery. He was convicted last year, sentenced to 29 years in prison and ordered to repay the \$1.3 million he stole in the robbery. The search for Foots' alleged partner continued. Last month, Clear Channel Outdoor digital billboards posted messages in Grand Prairie and Arlington seeking information on Williams, White said. The FBI's San Antonio division was recently notified that Williams was staying in that area. Authorities there think they barely missed snatching him, White said. "Apparently he caught wind that we were closing in on him, and he got out of there," White said. "But he left behind \$28,000" that the FBI recovered.

Authorities appealed to the public for information and received a tip on Saturday that Williams was in the Rosebud area, White said. Federal, state and local authorities closed in on that town of roughly 1,300 and found Williams at a residence, White said. He was taken into custody without incident. Williams was being held Sunday evening at the McLennan County Jail. The investigation is ongoing, White said. The 2007 robbery was not the first heist Williams and Foots were accused of pulling off together. Both were sentenced to 20 years in federal prison in a 1988 Dallas robbery that also targeted a Loomis armored car. The April 6, 1988, robbery netted about \$1.1 million. They were released before serving the entire 20 years. It was unclear Sunday whether anyone would be eligible for a \$45,000 reward offered for information leading to Williams' capture.

FBI New York Office Captures Fugitive in Gambino Organized Crime Family Case

Steven Maiurro was placed on the FBI New York's Featured Fugitives list on Tuesday, April 20. Investigative efforts and publicity led Maiurro to call the FBI's New York Office on Thursday afternoon, April 22. He surrendered later that evening and a court appearance is expected for later today. Maiurro faces federal charges for his alleged involvement in a sex trafficking operation run by the Gambino Crime Family in Staten Island and Brooklyn, New York. Maiurro is charged with four counts related to sex trafficking.

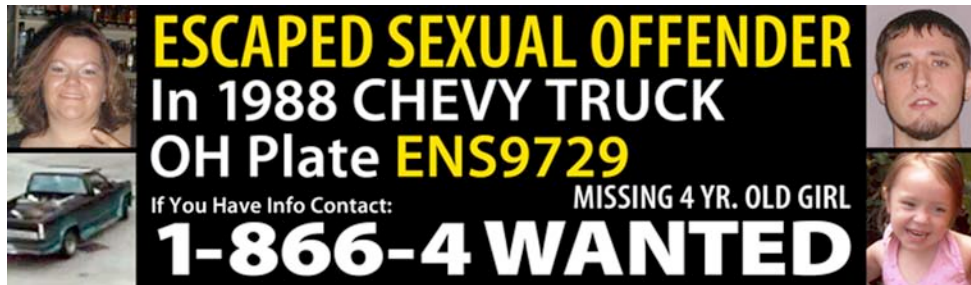


Clear Channel Outdoor billboard in Times Square showing captured fugitive Steven Maiurro

Clear Channel Outdoor Digital Networks Help Locate Escaped Sexual Predator, Girlfriend and 4-year-old Haylee Donathan

Tipster Reports Suspect After Seeing Digital Billboard in Las Vegas

PHOENIX – June 26, 2009

On Monday June 22nd 2009 Clear Channel Outdoor's Cleveland GM, Bill Platko, was contacted by Northeast Ohio's U.S. Marshall, Pete Elliot, asking for help with a search for an escaped sexual predator who was convicted of raping an eight-year-old girl and a nine-year-old boy. The predator's girlfriend helped him escape and they were on the run along with the girlfriend's four-year old daughter Haylee Donathan.

The group was spotted in Colorado, and the Marshall believed they were heading west. Elliot asked if CCO would run information on the digital billboards in areas where they were believed to be headed. Within a few hours CCO had the information and photos on digital networks in: Albuquerque, Dallas, El Paso, Ft. Smith, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, Orlando, Phoenix, San Antonio and Tampa.

The next day, a driver spotted one of the digital billboards near Las Vegas and alerted authorities that they had seen the suspects pictured on the billboard at a specific location in San Diego. Authorities were notified and the fugitives Robbi Potter and Candice Watson were immediately arrested. Watson's four-year-old daughter, Haylee Donathan, was taken into custody safely.

"Clear Channel made this happen and I am very proud of Bill Platko and Clear Channel Outdoor. Thanks to CCO this little girl is safe and can live a productive life," stated Elliot, "Both Bill and I were extremely pleased with the responsiveness and help from Clear Channel Outdoor's digital markets and their managers."

"We are extremely relieved that Haylee Donathan is safe and that the escaped sexual predator has been captured," stated Paul Meyer, CEO Clear Channel Outdoor. "It's very gratifying to know that our digital billboards directly helped bring resolution to this dangerous situation. This success story highlights the important role digital billboard networks can have in disseminating messages to the public quickly, and most importantly, effectively."
